PRE-K Fall is here! We will be learning about fall, harvest, and pumpkins. We will celebrate with our very own Pumpkin Patch.

KINDERGARTEN Kindergarten students are quickly learning our routine. They are already learning to read words and are working on writing simple sentences. In math, they are learning to count, write and recognize numbers to 10.

1ST GRADE The first graders are really falling into learning! It will be a great month for our first graders as we continue practicing our addition fluency. We will also be learning about long vowels and all kinds of nouns as the month continues. October will also be the start of our unit on spiders! We look forward to an awesome month!

2nd GRADE The second graders are looking forward to their field trip this month to Children's Museum . In reading, the students are working on determining main ideas and cause and effect in stories . In Math, the students are working on repeated addition (to prepare them for multiplication) and more addition and subtraction strategies with emphasis on place value. In Social Studies, they are working on a writing/continents project to show the origins of our multi-cultural families.

3rd GRADE We are starting our unit on addition and subtraction in Math. We will continue learning about animals and their adaptations in Science. In ELA, we will start reading about how the body works, and in Social Studies, we are learning about how technology has changed family and community life in Louisiana over time.

4th GRADE 4th grade will work on reading skills using the i-Ready workbooks. They will begin multiplication in Math. Please practice the multiplication facts at home with your child. In Science, they will learn about sound, light and heat, and in Social Studies they will study the north-east region of the United States. They will also begin using the *We The People* book.


5th GRADE This month the 5th graders are studying early civilization in Social Studies, chemical reactions and forces/motion in Science, and working on multiplication and division of multi-digit whole numbers in Math. The students are reading *Wonderstruck* and focusing on writing.
